

Bristol Motor Speedway's 2008 Saturday Spectacular Special Event Rules

RULES AND REGULATIONS

(These rules apply to all cars in Trailer Race, Appliance Race, Demolition Derby)

Inspection fees collected at entry will not be refunded if car does not pass inspection.

All who enter the pits must sign a Bristol Motor Speedway waiver (parental waiver must be signed for anyone under 18, and the person signing the waiver must be parent or guardian and must accompany the youth), and every individual in the pits must wear an armband indicating that he/she signed the waiver.

Officials reserve the right to approve or reject any car.

Officials reserve the right to enforce all rules or make on-the-spot calls as determined by the Speedway. All participants agree to abide by officials' decisions.

Absolutely no alcoholic beverages are allowed in the pit areas. Violation of this rule will result in disqualification and ejection from the property without refund.

Unsportsmanlike conduct will be grounds for disqualification and ejection without refund.

All cars and drivers must be registered no later than two (2) hours before the spectator grandstand gates open.

Bristol Motor Speedway will not be responsible for any cars, parts or personal property before, during or after the event.

Each car must be inspected before the special event, and it is each driver's responsibility to ensure that his/her car has been inspected.

Each driver must attend the drivers' meeting.

Towing and transporting cars to and from the event must meet all Tennessee highway safety codes.

Only American-made hardtop or sedan automobiles will be allowed. No trucks, convertibles, jeeps, SUVs, hearses, limousines, or Chrysler Imperials allowed.

No engine, transmission, gear or wheel modifications.

All glass, side windows, rear windows, headlights and taillights must be removed prior to entering Speedway property. Rolling windows down is not permitted.

Autos must be swept clean. No tires, wheels, metal parts, broken glass, etc., is allowed in the car.

All upholstery except the driver's seat must be removed. All unnecessary decks, handles, knobs, or sharp objects must be removed from the car. Chrome molding strips and all fiberglass or plastic front header panels must be removed.

Any sharp fins must be compacted or cut off.

No objects may be mounted to the top of a car – no flags or stuffed animals.

No special bumpers or reinforcement modifications permitted. Fenders and bumper ends may be trimmed to allow for wheel clearance. All cars must have bumpers chained to frame. Doors must be welded solid or bolted. No engine mounts recommended.

Radiators must remain in original position. Comparable replacement radiators are permitted.

Roll bars must be in driver's side. No braces outside the driver's compartment.

Transmission coolers are permitted, but only if they are secured inside the engine compartment.

Only one battery (any size) allowed. Battery must be securely fastened and covered. If the battery is moved from its original position, it must be securely fastened to the floorboard and covered.

Hood and trunk must be pinned down. Hoods must remain on cars.

Stock gas tanks must be mounted forward of the rear axle, secured by metal straps and covered by a fireproof shield. No reserve tanks allowed. All caps, fittings and lines must be leak-proof.

It is recommended that the driver's door be reinforced inside with pipe. The length of the pipe is not to extend more than eight (8) inches on either side of the driver's door.

An opening approximately eight (8) inches by eight (8) inches must be cut in the hood over the carburetor. It is recommended that a similar hole be cut into the deck lid for visibility. Both the hood and trunk must be fastened securely and have no other holes cut.

All cars must have approved seat belts secured to the frame or body.

Both front doors must remain on the car for safety and numbering. Special numbers are permitted. If any car arrives and has a duplicate number that is already registered, then the car owner that registered first will have priority to keep the number. Car numbers that are distinctive and clearly visible from the tower must be placed on each side and on the roof of each car. No profanity may be displayed on any car.

A strong wire or mesh screen is required in the driver's windshield area.

Drivers must wear safety belts, an approved helmet, and goggles, safety glasses, or face shield.

A fire extinguisher must be mounted securely inside the driver's compartment, and driver must be able to reach and operate the fire extinguisher.

Vehicles must have brakes at the time of inspection.

Cars must not drive through the pit area unless directed by a Speedway official.

All cars must be removed from Speedway property immediately following the event (no later than noon the day after the event).

No riders permitted at any time in any of the special event cars.

TRAILER RACE RULES

All cars must be equipped with a trailer hitch.

A limited number of trailers may be available from the promoter. Once the available trailers are claimed on a first-come, first-served basis, the driver is responsible for securing his/her trailer.

Trailers must be stripped of all glass.

Trailers must be standard camper or boat trailer.

Cars will be disqualified if the trailer and car become separated.

APPLIANCE RACE RULES

Trailer hitches must be removed from all cars.

A limited number of appliances may be available from the promoter. Once the available appliances are claimed on a first-come, first-served basis, the driver is responsible for securing two major home appliances (washer, dryer, dishwasher, gas or electric range, i.e. combination oven and range-top burners). Note: microwave ovens, range tops and other small appliances not eligible.

Appliances must be placed on the hood or deck of the car and secured with one strap or a series of straps that make one continuous strap from one front wheel well to the other front wheel well.

DEMOLITION DERBY RULES

Trailer hitches must be removed from all cars.

No deliberate head-on hits.

No deliberate driver's side door hits.

One-minute rule in effect. Cars not making aggressive contact at least once each minute subject to disqualification.
